**ENABLE (Empowering Next-Generation Advocates for a Better Environment)** is an initiative designed to empower youth aged 18–30—including those from marginalized and underserved communities—by placing them at the forefront of climate action and civic engagement. Aligned with the 2030 Agenda and the 17 SDGs, ENABLE places special emphasis on climate action, social inclusion, and sustainable development.

### Objectives

- **Enhance** youth participation in climate governance
- **Foster** climate awareness and advocacy skills
- **Promote** social inclusion for vulnerable youth
- **Strengthen** civic competencies and critical thinking
- **Support** European values and unity through cross-border collaboration



The ENABLE Project recently held its **Youth Climate Policy Dialogues in Luxembourg City**, Luxembourg, gathering young people from France, Greece, Bulgaria, Croatia, Italy, Luxembourg and Hungary who are passionate about climate action and civic participation.

Taking place on **31 March–1 April 2026**, the event created an interactive and supportive environment where participants aged 18–30 could share experiences, learn from one another, and understand the importance of SDGs 13, 16, and 17.

With engaging workshops, group discussions, and a group visit to the Europa Experience Centre at the European Parliament in Luxembourg. The event encouraged youth to step forward as confident voices for climate justice and inclusive democracy.

Hosted by **Innovation & Sustainable Development Institute Luxembourg** together with the **ENABLE consortium**, the event fostered greater cooperation throughout Europe, encouraged social inclusion and motivated young leaders to implement positive initiatives in their own communities.



## Day 1 – Youth Climate Policy Dialogues & Group Visit to the Europa Experience Centre

The first day, marking the official launch of Work Package 8 entitled Youth Climate Policy Dialogues, began with a welcome coffee and participant registration at the venue (Silversquare Liberté, Luxembourg). The morning session opened with a presentation on **Sustainable Development Goals 13, 16, and 17**, complemented by an introductory video covering all SDGs to ensure a shared baseline of understanding among participants. This session helped familiarise attendees with key global priorities related to climate action, peace and justice, and partnerships for sustainable development. Following a short coffee break, the programme continued with the Youth Climate Policy Dialogues, facilitated by an experienced moderator. The day concluded with a group visit to the Europa Experience Centre, where participants gained deeper insight into European Union values, institutions and decision-making processes. Through interactive exhibits and a collaborative quiz activity, participants further strengthened their understanding of EU governance while engaging in teamwork and informal learning

## Day 2 – Exploring Luxembourg City & Imagining Regenerative Futures

On the second day, participants took part in a guided tour of key sites in Luxembourg City, combining historical reflection with institutional awareness. The visit included important landmarks such as the SOAH (Shoah) Memorial, alongside significant European and national institutional buildings. This activity provided participants with a deeper understanding of Luxembourg's historical memory, particularly in relation to World War II and the Holocaust, while also highlighting the country's role as a central hub for European governance. Through the exploration of both commemorative and institutional spaces, participants were able to connect discussions on democracy, human rights and civic responsibility with real-world contexts. The day also included a shared lunch at an Italian restaurant, offering participants a relaxed setting to continue informal discussions and strengthen interpersonal connections. In the evening, a social farewell dinner provided participants with the opportunity to reflect on the overall experience, celebrate the connections built throughout the programme and bring the mobility to a meaningful close.
